

On Wednesday May 30, 2018, at 4:06 p.m., the Dayton City Commission met in special session in the Commission Chambers of City Hall for the installation ceremonies for Commissioner-Elect Darryl Fairchild. Mayor Whaley made welcoming remarks.

INVOCATION

Mayor Whaley called on the Reverend Dr. Perry E. Henderson, Pastor of Corinthian Baptist Church, to give the Invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Whaley led the public in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Roll call was taken and Mayor Whaley, Commissioners Joseph, Mims, Shaw and Vacant were present. The Clerk of Commission, Ms. Rashella Lavender, and the City Manager, Ms. Shelley Dickstein, were also present.

SWEARING-IN CEREMONY

After roll call, Mayor Whaley asked the Clerk, “Ms. Lavender, what is the nature and order of business for this meeting?”

Ms. Lavender said, “Your Honor, under Section 39 of the Charter of the City of Dayton, it is provided that a Special Meeting be held to review the results of the Municipal Election and that the Commission shall meet, at which time the newly elected Commissioner shall assume the duties of the office.” “Section 40 of the Charter further provides that the City Commission shall be judge of the election and qualification of its members.”

Mayor Whaley said, “Ms. Lavender, do you have a copy of the Certificate of Election for the person who will assume office today?”

Ms. Lavender said, “Yes, Your Honor, I do. The Certificate from the Montgomery County Board of Elections affirm that Darryl Fairchild has been elected to the Office of Commissioner; for the unexpired term ending January 3, 2022. At this time, I will present the certificates for review.”

Following review of the Certificate of Election by the members of the City Commission, the Mayor said, “The Commission is satisfied that the person, as announced by Ms. Lavender, has been duly elected and do qualify for the office indicated.”

Ms. Lavender said, “Being that the Commission is satisfied with the presentation of the certificate, a record of the certificate will be submitted accordingly.”

Mayor Whaley said, “Ms. Lavender, are we ready to proceed with the administering of the Oath?”

Ms. Lavender said, “Yes. I am advised that Commissioner-Elect Fairchild wishes his Oath to be administered by Ms. Veda Renshaw and Mr. Fredrick England, and accompanied by his Spouse, Mrs. Kimberly Armentrout and Ms. Maya Fairchild, daughter. The Oath was given and Commissioner Fairchild took his seat on the dais.

Ms. Lavender said, “Mayor Whaley, the Dayton City Commission is now officially installed. Congratulations Commissioner Fairchild.”

Mayor Whaley called upon members of the City Commission to make their comments.

Commissioner Joseph congratulated Commissioner Fairchild. He said this commission has many challenges to work on but the best is yet to come.

Mayor Whaley

Mayor Whaley congratulated Commissioner Fairchild and welcomed him to one of the hardest working bodies and staff.

Mayor Whaley thanked those in attendance and called on the Reverend Dr. Sherry Gale, Pastor of Grace United Methodist Church, for the benediction.
